We have some exciting things to look forward to at KOS. Our upcoming meeting will feature a presentation by Dr. Larry Zettler of Illinois College on saving orchids in the wild. I have posted his bio and more details about his presentation on our website. Check it out!

They stabilize the orchids we have in the display, improve the appearance of our display, and increase our profit! Please bring 2, 3 or more to donate to the cause. Any size is appreciated! If you bring them to the February meeting, I'll make sure that they get used in the Home, Garden and Remodeling show! There is a pic below of some I happen to have. We can all help to make this show a profitable one for our society.



For our next monthly meeting, in March, we are going to share our secrets on growing orchids in a new way. This program started with a suggestion from one of our members submitted at our Christmas party. The request was to have members who had been growing for awhile describe how to grow various types of orchids. I have decided to try a "speed dating" platform. This is something popularized in the late 90's to allow eligible singles to meet a large number of potential partners in a short period of time.
