Letter from the Vice President:

August, what to expect this month for our orchids? We've had some rather hot days in July already, are more to come? Around here August can be pretty hot but then some orchids love that and many will start setting spikes!

For those of us who have their orchids outside for the summer ('summer camp') it can be a tricky month. Hot, dry, no wind meaning little air circulation, blazing sun all conditions that most of our orchids do not like. We may need to give mother nature a hand with more frequent misting/watering and certainly need to hold off on fertilizing. Heat stressed plants should not be fertilized as this only adds to more stress. Check the leaves and if they feel warm, some gentle misting is in order.

Shade cloth is a must if no large trees are available.

As the flower gardens are passing their peak, the vegetable gardens are coming into their own. Lots of produce is ready to be picked and preserving/pickling will be in our near future.

After this month we will have a hiatus of two months without a speaker, as we have to plan for our October show and review the results that same month.

This month we have Eric Sauer, president of Miami Valley Orchid Society (MVOS) as our speaker. Most of us do know him from the many Zoom meetings/speakers we have shared during the covid times. Since Eric has a business, specializes in orchids from Ecuador (esp. Maxillarias) but not exclusive, he will bring some plants for sale to the meeting. His talk will cover many aspects of orchid growing however he will not discuss particular genera. 
