EDUCATION: Watering Using Leca

Watering with Leca is very simple.

<u>HOW</u>: You must fill the pot/container all the way up, allowing the extra water to drain rapidly out of the 2 holes on the side of the pot. To conserve water (I really don't like to do this. I like the benefit of a little extra water flushing through) you can plug the 2 holes in the side of the pot with your fingers until the pot is full, then release and let the excess water drain out. **DO NOT just fill the reservoir at the bottom of the pot.** The water flushing through the pot rinses the Leca by removing the waste particles, evenly brings moisture to all the media, and restores the chemical balance in the pot. Failure to water thusly will eventually bring root and plant decline and death. The pot turns into a stagnant, toxic "swamp" of chemical waste.

<u>WHEN</u>: I'd suggest at least weekly. But in pinch you can go until the reservoir is empty. Possibly more frequently when the environment is hot or dry. The great news is you can't overwater!

<u>FERTILIZER</u>: A weekly, weak solution is best. How much to use is hotly debated. The suggestion is to maintain a nitrogen level (N) between 25-50 PPM. Around 25 is the target Fertilizers have an N-P-K rating. That's the 3 numbers listed on most product Ex: K Lite is 12-1-1. If you are using KLite, MSU, or Gro-Better an 1/8 tsp. per gallon should work fine and give you about 28ppm. Remember, the media offers no nutrients in and of itself. However, the plants have access to fertilizer water continually in the bottom inch of the pot.
