Bob has been an active AOS judge in the Cincinnati Judging region as well as his home region of the Carolinas. He is also active with many of the local societies. In the picture below, you can see him accepting his Presidential hat from former president Eric Sauers. If you are new to the MAOC, this prestigious exchange is a badge of honor going



back as long as I can remember and that's about 37 years.

Bob would like to continue rebuilding the MAOC; and in keeping with its history. We have limped through Covid and hard times that came with it. However, the MAOC continued its core values/orchid resources and is now starting that rebuild. At the meeting in Kettering, Ron Kaufmann shared the goals and some of the success of the AOS Conservation Committee. He was surprised to know that our constitution and theirs are almost word for word the same. Bill Moorison (MAOC Committee chair) got to talk with him at length about the MAOC to make sure we collaborate and share our successes. It was also shared with the AOS some of our resources include one of the best orchid schedules in the country including a cross reference for entering each type of orchid, a dictionary of all the hybrid names and their make-ups, Dendrobium and Paphiopedilum cheat sheets, and our revised electronic schedule entry system.

With time, perhaps we can get to a point that our MAOC shows are again booked out 5-6 years in advance, the shows attract 100's of our members from MANY states and Canada. The KOS has hosted several, maybe 5, of these events or equivalent, and we loved it, the members loved it, and we broke even!
